

## Fire Advisories, Restrictions, and Bans-Archived

---



### NO RESTRICTION

Safe campfires are allowed in campgrounds and backcountry or random camping areas. Any burning other than a campfire requires a fire permit.

Fire permits are required during fire season for any type of burning in the FPA, except campfires. Safe campfires are allowed in campgrounds and back country or random camping areas.



### FIRE ADVISORY

Safe campfires are permitted in campgrounds and backcountry or random camping areas. Issuance of fire permits for other burning may be restricted.

The fire hazard rating has increased. Fire permits may be restricted. Safe campfires are allowed in campgrounds and back country or random camping areas, but this level is a warning they may be restricted if the situation doesn't improve.



### FIRE RESTRICTION

Safe campfires are allowed in fire rings in campgrounds only. No open fires are allowed in backcountry or random camping areas. Fire permits may be suspended or cancelled and no new fire permits will be issued.

Safe campfires are allowed in fire rings in campgrounds only. No campfires (or other open fires) or charcoal briquettes are allowed in back country or random camping areas. Gas or propane stoves/barbeques and portable propane fire pits are allowed.

Fire permits may be suspended or cancelled and no new fire permits will be issued. If the situation continues to worsen, ESRD will put on a fire ban.



## **FIRE BAN**

No open fires are allowed in campgrounds or in backcountry or random camping areas. All fire permits are suspended or cancelled and no new fire permits will be issued.

No campfires (or other open fires) are allowed in campgrounds or back country and random camping areas. This includes charcoal briquettes. Gas or propane stoves/barbeques and portable propane fire pits are allowed. All fire permits are suspended or cancelled and no new fire permits will be issued.

### **Saddle Hills County Fire Advisory**

Due to ongoing dry conditions and high temperatures open burning of brush piles and other heavy fuels is not recommended at this time.

Please exercise caution when conducting activities in dry cured fuels.

ATV engines and exhaust systems can cause wildfires, please ensure that debris is removed from these areas (Knock It Off)

Please make sure your campfire is completely extinguished when you leave it (Soak It, Stir It, Soak It Again)

If the fire hazard continues to increase, further restrictions may be implemented.

### **Saddle Hills County Fire Restriction**

Due to increasing dry conditions and high temperatures open burning of brush piles and other heavy fuels is not allowed at this time.

Safe campfires are allowed in home and designated campground fire pits only.

Please exercise caution when conducting activities in dry cured fuels.

All fireworks permits are suspended until conditions improve.

ATV engines and exhaust systems can cause wildfires, please ensure that debris is removed from these areas (Knock It Off)

Please make sure your campfire is completely extinguished when you leave it (Soak It, Stir It, Soak It Again)



If the fire hazard continues to increase, a complete fire ban will be implemented.

### **Saddle Hills County Fire Ban**

Due to extreme dry conditions and high temperatures open burning of combustible fuels is not allowed at this time.

No campfires are allowed. Gas or propane stoves/barbeques and portable propane fire pits are allowed.

All fireworks permits are suspended until conditions improve.

Please exercise extreme caution when conducting any activities in dry cured fuels.

ATV engines and exhaust systems can cause wildfires, please ensure that debris is removed from these areas (Knock It Off)

This fire ban will remain in place until conditions improve.
