Saddle Hills County Road Bans

Pursuant to the Saddle Hills County By-law 80-1998 and policy no. PW04, effective at 8:00 a.m. on April 1, 2009 a 50% axle weight road ban is in effect for:

- Range Road 84 from HWY 681 to TWP 822
- Range Road 90 from HWY 681 to TWP 813
- Range Road 92 from HWY 681 to TWP 813
- Range Road 93 from HWY 681 to TWP 813
- TWP Rd. 813 from Range Road 93 to Range Road 90
- TWP Rd. 811 from Secondary HWY 725 to Range Road 82
- TWP Rd. 800 from Secondary HWY 727 to Range Road 80
- Range Road 105 from Secondary HWY 681 to TWP 812
- Range Road 121 from TWP 810 to Secondary HWY 681
- Range Road 121 from Secondary HWY 681 to TWP 802

All other graveled roads within Saddle Hills County have been banned at 75% of axle weight. SADDLE HILLS COUNTY Bursary

Two scholarships of \$1,750 are offered annually and an additional NADC Partnership Bursary, in the amount of \$1,750, is available for both. To be eligible, candidates must:

- be a resident of Saddle Hills County for a minimum of one year and a one year resident in Alberta immediately prior to the application date,
- be enrolled full time in a post secondary program recognized by Alberta Advanced Education,
- be committed to living and working in northern Alberta, and
- have reasonably good prospects for employment in northern Alberta after graduation.

To apply for the bursary:

- write a paragraph of at least 500 words detailing your chosen field of study,
- supply two (2) letters of reference,
- complete the scholarship application
- Complete the application for NADC Bursary Partnerships Program.

Fire and Ice REDUCING THE RISK OF WINTER BURNING

With snow now blanketing much of the province, Albertans may assume there's enough moisture to eliminate the chance of starting a wildfire. While the risk of starting fires is low, there may still be holdover fires.

Holdover fires often start during the fall and winter months as a result of improperly extinguished fires. These fires smoulder underground for a number of months and come to the surface in the spring as a wildfire after the snow pack has melted and fuel such as dry grass and wood becomes more abundant.

To avoid accidentally starting a holdover fire, it's important to make sure any winter burning is completely extinguished. To properly extinguish a fire, completely soak the area with water, stir up the ashes and soak the area again. Checking your winter burn sites early in the spring for any hot spots will also help reduce the risk. Alberta Sustainable Resource Development is committed to working with Albertans to reduce the number of human-caused wildfire. About 50 per cent of wildfires in Alberta are caused by human activity...it's important we all do our part to help prevent wildfires and protect our forests.
