Road Bans: Treading Lightly

Pursuant to Saddle Hills County By-law 80-1998, and policy no. PW04, effective at 8:00 a.m. on March 4, 2010 the following road bans have taken effect:

50 % axle weight on:

Saddle Hills County requires a contract sprayer to perform herbicide application on County road rights-of-way.

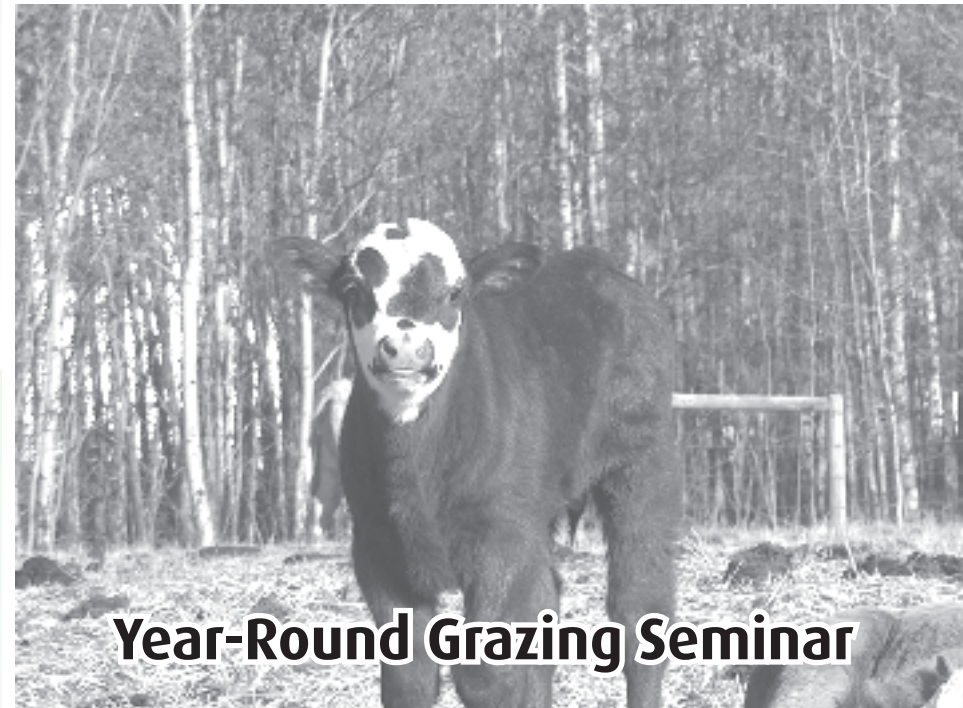
Scope of Project:
