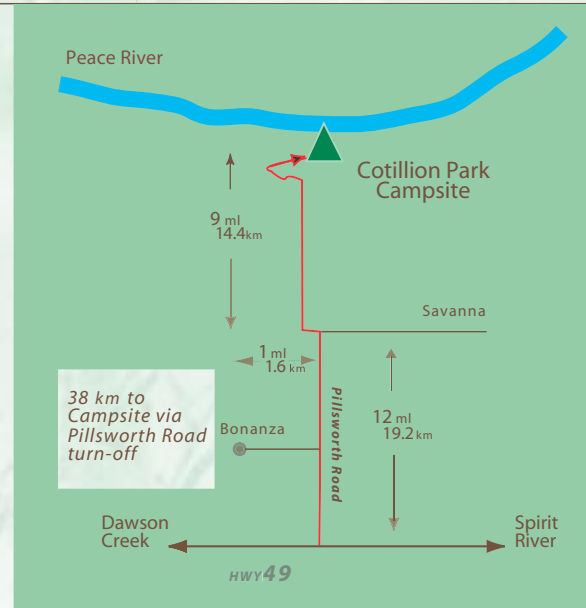
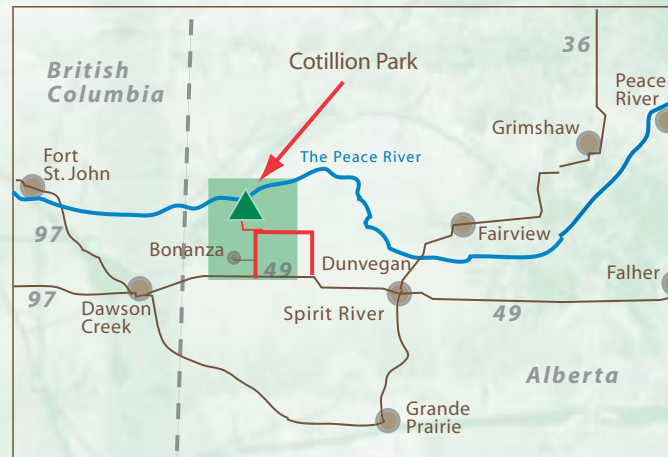




COTILLION PARK

COTILLION PARK is one of the campsites included in the "UPPER PEACE VALLEY RECREATION AREA." This Northwestern Alberta project extends for 230 km along the Peace River, from the Alberta/BC border through to the town of Peace River.

The portion of the river at Cotillion Park, offers the same spectacular view that impressed Alexander Mackenzie in 1793 as he paddled up river searching for the route to the Pacific Ocean. This historic route is the *Alexander Mackenzie "SEA to SEA" trail* which follows the path the explorer travelled.

Rugged sandstone cliffs weathered into intriguing hoodoo formations; undisturbed parkland forests sheltering moose, deer, black bear, beaver, bald eagles.

This pristine parkland with it's abundance of wildlife and breathtaking vistas' greet the traveller.

- 12 RV camp stalls
- five stalls have power hook-ups
- fire pits, fire wood
- picnic tables
- covered picnic shelter, cook stove
- washroom and shower facilities
- telephone
- access to river
- horse off loading and hitching rails
- horse feeding area and horse trailer parking
- multi-purpose nature trails for hiking or horseback riding
- day use picnic area
- private group barbecue area
- trailer dumping station
- 35 miles of well maintained gravel road into campsite
- custodian visits the campsite daily

May 15th—October 15th

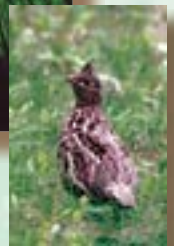
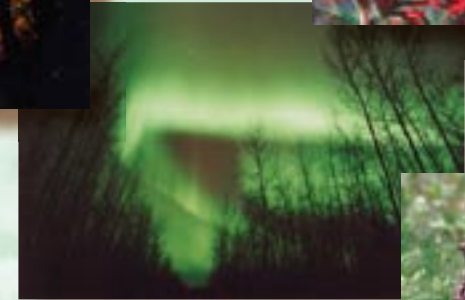
Fee per night:

According to local folklore the area was originally called Cotillion Butte, the name given to a neighbouring round hill where the sharpe-tail grouse held their mating dance.

The park offers secluded campsites in a wilderness setting with the convenience of a covered kitchen shelter, showers and washrooms. A telephone and trailer dumping station are also available.
