2026 REQUEST FOR SEASONAL TRAPPERS

Saddle Hills County is inviting experienced trappers holding a valid Alberta trapper's licence to submit a quote for pest removal services in 2026. Work will be carried out on an as-needed basis, in advance of County staff clearing waterways and culverts. Trappers must provide their own vehicle and all required equipment. Applicants are required to review the full eligibility criteria and service specifications prior to submitting a quote. REMOTE POTABLE WATER HAULING SUBSIDY

The Remote Potable Water Hauling Subsidy provides a fair and equitable subsidy to Saddle Hills County residents who will not be able connect to the Rural Potable Waterline. Council has approved additional eligible properties, including eight in the Woking service area, two in the Ksituan service area, and one in the Savanna service area. Residents must apply yearly to remain eligible.
