## GET READY TO CAMP: RESERVATIONS OPEN APRIL 6

Camping season is just around the corner, with reservations opening April 6, 2026 for Hilltop Lake, Cotillion Park, and Spring Lake. ## BRUSH PILE BURNING

March 1 marks the beginning of wildfire season. Fires in the FPA (Forest Protection Area) require a permit through Alberta Forestry during fire season; burns outside the FPA require a controlled burn notification through Saddle Hills County. When burning brush piles, remember to follow safe burning practices. Check winter burn sites often. Fires can smoulder underground for weeks or even months and may reignite in warm, dry weather. When revisiting a winter burn site:

- Spread remaining ashes and debris.
- Check the ground for any hot spots for any lingering ground fire.
- Douse the area to fully extinguish the burn and stir ashes with heavy equipment or hand tools.
- Ensure the area is cold to the touch.

## PERMITS REQUIRED FOR DITCHING

A reminder that permits are required for any work in County ditches and rights-of-way. Landowners must contact the County before starting any work, including approach construction or modifications, ditching (new or existing), brushing, or any work within developed or undeveloped rights-of-way. Rights-of-way provide access and accommodate utilities such as power, phone, internet, gas lines, and pipelines. Permits are free and must be obtained in advance. ## 2026 FENCELINE SPRAYING AND DO NOT SPRAY AGREEMENTS

The Agricultural Services Department conducts their annual spraying and mowing programs on County Road allowances, using a 3-year rotational cycle, to ensure effective weed and pest control for the entirety of the County. Tentative spray areas for 2026 will include but are not limited to: **Blueberry Mountain, Whitburn, Happy Valley and East Woking**. Each year, Saddle Hills County offers dust control treatments on roads in front of residences at a cost approved by Council. Rates for 2026 are as follows:

- Residential: \$200 (plus GST) per 100m
- Industrial: \$670 (plus GST) per 100m
