WOKING MULTIPLEX ANNUAL FUNDRAISER - JAN. 31



SECURITY SYSTEM & HIGH-SPEED INTERNET GRANT

Saddle Hills County recently updated the Residential Security System Grant to now include high-speed internet. The grant assists County residents with offsetting the cost of the purchase and installation of security systems and/or high-speed internet on their property. The grant is split into two parts – high-speed internet or residential security system. Eligible residents may apply for one or both parts of the grant. Each grant is one-time funding per residence, up to a maximum of \$500. Both grants together would provide up to a total maximum funding of \$1,000 per residence. **Applicants who have already applied for and received funds for a residential security system under this grant, may still be eligible to apply for the high-speed Internet portion of the grant.** For more information and to apply, visit saddlehills.ab.ca/Security-Grant
