HAPPY VALLEY AG & RECREATION CLUB AGM - FEB. 1

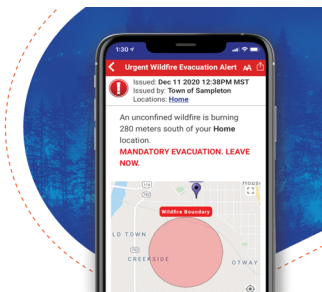
